The January 14, 2026 meeting was called to order by Vice President Gary Wyland at 1900 hours at the club pavilion. There were nine officers and seventeen members signed in.

MINUTES: Mike Evangelista motioned to waive the reading of the minutes. Paul Callendar seconded and the motion passed.

TREASURER: Ted Kozenko presented the balances. Square: \$579.04 Checking \$42,617.40 Savings \$157,723.86

PRESIDENT: Tom Rowan was not present.

1st VP: Gary Wyland informed the club that the neighbors have filed a trespassing complaint on their property by hunters. This is under investigation by the board. Members are responsible for knowing the property boundaries. The board will spend time when the weather permits to refresh the property markers. 2nd VP MEMBERSHIP: Jennifer Greig was not present. The club will begin collecting dues in January. You may pay at a meeting or mail to PO Box 81 Painesville, OH 44077. Include a self addressed stamped envelope will speed up the process of your new card being sent to you. DUES MUST BE PAID AND WORK HOURS COMPLETED BY MARCH 31, 2026. There is NO grace period. If all monies/hours are not in/completed membership will be dropped. Life Members annual dues are \$20 – no work hours required. Regular members – annual dues are \$100 plus you must have completed 15 work hours. For each unworked work hour there is a \$15 per unworked hour fee. If you are a regular member and still paying installment fees, please refer to your membership card for the amount due – 15 work hours are also required. SECRETARY: Kevin Dauterman wants to remind those to update their email and address for club records. Dauterman will be taking over the USPS newsletter. Anyone who's email address gets rejected will be moved to USPS.

MADISON PROPERTY: Rod Merrill reminded the members that the timber is available for members. Plowing will only be upon request. Merrill motioned for funds to run power to the outhouse by the pavilion. Material costs are estimated at \$1,000 for the project. Ted Kozenko seconded the motion and it passed. If there are additional costs, Merrill will present the request to the board. Merrill also noted that a non-member drove down the club road and got their vehicle stuck. Merrill will post a sign informing the public that this is a private road and any vehicle is operating at their own risk.

LUCKY SHOOT: Ken Swiger was not present.

FUNDRAISING: Lonnie Sparkman informed the members of a new winter raffle with three firearms. Ruger Model 77, a Marlin rifle, a Savage rifle with optic, and a tree stand and high-end shooting stick. Tickets will be \$10 a piece or 3 for \$20. Sparkman also informed the members of restaurant gift cards up for raffle. Sparkman motioned for \$12,000 for starting funds for the picnic raffle and the winter raffle. \$10,000 for the picnic and \$2,000 for the winter raffle. Frank Davis seconded with the motion passing. Tickets will be reduced to the original price of \$20 a piece or 3 for \$50.
